Incorporating concrete examples, real-life scenarios, and statistical evidence significantly strengthened arguments and enhanced analytical depth. Emphasizing revision and proofreading helped students refine language, correct grammar errors, and improve overall coherence.

The findings suggest that teaching advantage and disadvantage essays requires targeted guidance. Instructors should model essay planning, demonstrate linking techniques, and encourage the use of evaluative language. Practicing balanced discussion and critical evaluation fosters higher-order thinking skills, preparing students not only for exams like IELTS but also for academic writing tasks across disciplines.
