His Persian poetry, influenced by classical Persian poets such as Hafiz, Sa'di, and Jami, integrates traditional elements with his unique artistic vision, making his works a valuable part of Persian literary heritage.

By examining selected poetic examples, the paper highlights the significance of these literary techniques and their role in shaping Navoiy's poetic legacy.

Navoiy's Persian poetry incorporates a range of artistic techniques, including: Metaphor and Symbolism: Navoiy frequently employs metaphors to convey philosophical, spiritual, and romantic themes. His use of symbolic imagery reflects Sufi mysticism and deep emotional expression. Simile and Allegory: His poems often draw comparisons to nature, celestial bodies, and divine love, creating multi-layered meanings. Hyperbole and Exaggeration: A common feature in Persian poetry, hyperbolic expressions in Navoiy's works enhance the grandeur of emotions and concepts. Personification: The poet gives human attributes to natural elements, reinforcing the interconnectedness between humanity and the universe.

The study of Alisher Navoiy's literary heritage, particularly his Persian poetry, has attracted considerable scholarly attention. Various researchers have analyzed his works from linguistic, literary, and philosophical perspectives, highlighting his mastery of poetic techniques and rhetorical devices. This section reviews key studies and sources related to Navoiy's use of artistic imagery and figurative language in Persian poetry.

Many scholars, including Bertels (1948), Arberry (1958), and Jami (1492), have explored the influence of classical Persian poets such as Rudaki, Ferdowsi, Sa'di, Hafiz, and Jami on Navoiy's artistic vision. Their works emphasize how Persian literary traditions, particularly in the use of metaphor, simile, allegory, and mystical symbolism, shaped Navoiy's poetic language. Studies by Lazar (1978) and Nafisi (2003) further highlight how Navoiy synthesized these influences while maintaining his distinct poetic style.

Research by Karimov (1995) and Sodiqov (2011) has specifically focused on Navoiy's use of figurative expressions, such as metaphor, hyperbole, and personification, in his Persian poetry. These studies indicate that Navoiy's rhetorical style was deeply embedded in Sufi thought, drawing on themes of divine love, spiritual journey, and the transient nature of worldly existence. Mirzoev (2006) examined how symbolism in Navoiy's Persian ghazals aligns with the mystical traditions of Persian poetry, particularly in comparison to Jalaluddin Rumi and Attar.

Several scholars, including DeWeese (2015) and Muhammadjonov (2018), have explored the differences and similarities between Navoiy's Persian and Chagatai poetry. Their research highlights that while his Turkic poetry emphasizes social and moral themes, his Persian poetry tends to be more philosophical and mystical, using ornate imagery and refined stylistic devices.

Contemporary literary scholars such as Rahmonov (2020) and Habibullayev (2021) have examined the linguistic richness and artistic nuances of Navoiy's Persian poetry using modern literary and linguistic analysis. Their studies suggest that Navoiy's poetic structure, rhyme schemes, and choice of poetic devices contributed significantly to the evolution of Persian literary aesthetics in the Timurid period.

The literature review demonstrates that Navoiy's Persian poetry is a rich and multi-dimensional literary phenomenon, drawing from classical Persian traditions, mystical philosophy, and innovative rhetorical techniques. Prior research has established the importance of figurative language, symbolism, and artistic imagery in his poetic works, but further studies are needed to explore the comparative nuances between his Persian and Turkic poetry. This paper builds upon these existing studies by providing an in-depth analysis of specific artistic devices in Navoiy's Persian works and their contribution to his poetic legacy.

To analyze the artistic and figurative devices in Alisher Navoiy's Persian poetry, this study employs a qualitative literary analysis approach, focusing on the identification and interpretation of key rhetorical techniques used in his poetic works. The research methodology includes:

1. Textual Analysis – A detailed examination of selected Persian poems by Navoiy, identifying the use of metaphors, similes, allegories, hyperboles, and personifications to determine their artistic significance.
2. Comparative Analysis – A comparison of Navoiy's Persian poetry with the works of classical Persian poets such as Hafiz, Sa'di, and Jami, exploring similarities and differences in the use of figurative language.
